Terry announced that Scott Sackett will not be able to host the meeting at his airfield in October. Georgina Edgington volunteered to move her date up from November to October, which will allow for more time for someone to volunteer for the November meeting.

DEAR TERRY.

It was a pleasure to visit with you this morning and acknowledge receipt of the Texas Chapter Choice Award. As I mentioned it was quite a surprise to open the package, also Mary and I felt honored to receive your recognition.

You may be aware of some of the following from the Pellegreno's connection to our family. My Dad, Willard Carson, started flying Taylorcrafts in Cedar Rapids in 1937, receiving his private license in 1938. He flew in the CAP during WWII, also flew to Miami, Fl., in January 1941, on the air tour being sponsored in that era. He took a friend along as a passenger in a 50 hp Cont. powered Taylorcraft owned by his instructor, Ted Saxon.

In 1943, Dad found a Taylorcraft BC-65, NC29624, Ser.# 2466, built 12-10-40, for sale in Meriden, Cn. He took a train to Long Island, NY, and found his way up to Meriden. He bought the plane for \$1800 and flew it back to lowa. It took him four days with bad weather and trying to find fuel during this gas rationing period. Dad bought 17 acres 3 miles north of his home in Troy Mills, Ia. in 1944, created a 1700' N-S landing strip, built a hangar and created his pilot's dream.

Seven members of the Carson family learned

to fly in his airplane over the years. In the early 50's he also acquired an Ercoupe for him and mom to fly, my brother and I flew the T-craft. My wife and I bought the plane from dad in 1976, a few months after mom died, dad continued to fly the Ercoupe. Dad passed away in 2004, at the age of 84. He still lived on the 17 acres where they had built a home to be close to their airplanes.

In November, 2006, we decided to do a total rebuild and recover it and finish it in the same paint scheme it had received from the factory. This was completed in December, 2007. Mary and I have really enjoyed the experience and fun associated with completely restoring the "family airplane."

The Texas Chapter Award really goes to Dad who instilled a love of flying in me with a very rewarding and meaningful activity. I am 75 years old and the Taylorcraft and me are getting older together, for a long time yet, I hope.

Thanks to all the Chapter members for this award.
