### AIRLINER AVOIDS DISASTER!

Kittie Hill Airport, Leander, Texas

Tension engulfed the air here early this peacefully windy January morning as another airliner narrowly avoided a disastrous situation. WSA flight number two was making its usual taxi to re-fuel and, hopefully to the passengers aboard, make its normal take-off into what is considered the crowded skies. But, the loading of the highly volatile and toxic one-hundred octane leaded aviation fuel was delayed. Not by a failure of pumps, tanks, ladders, hoses, or of the highly trained ground support personnel necessary to refuel the mighty aircraft, but by the failure of a single, critical part: A two-dollar AN aviation-grade, FAA certified, A&P installed tail-wheel attach bolt failed, in what investigators called... "shear".

- "Well, uhh, about the time we got the ground support equipment in place, Tommm... ugh, a competitor's air service employee, came over and said he had a replace ment airworthy part back in his hangar, and would bring it over and we could use it to repair the aircraft".
- "So you made the repairs while blocking the active runway?"
- "Well, yeah...we did."
- "You shut down Kittie Hill airport for over a half hour?"
- "Ahh, yup, sure as hell did. But what the hell, we've got three grass runways for Christ's sake".
- "Why, Captain, that is totally irresponsible and unprofessional of you".
- "Given the options, lady, I think I made the right decision".
- "You, sir, are a disgrace to your profession".
- "Yes, Ma'm, I am. And you are a bitch. How ever, in an hour or so I will be back in the air, doing my job, and I will have learned from my experience. And in an hour or so, you will still be a bitch".
