AMERICAN EAGLET TO POLAR GROVE AIRPORT MUSEUM.

My American Eaglet NC548Y, model 230, is no longer in the family. It all started in 1975 when I bought it from Earnie Siler in Marshfield, Mo.

My son Ken and I flew it home, Hampshire, II in 6 legs with my old A model Bonanza. I had previously flown another Eaglet which also had a tail skid and no brakes. This was to be Ken's first experience at same, and he handled it like a pro, and believe me that is another world. Supposedly the last leg, from Princeton, II, Ken flying. After I propped him I noticed that the valve clearance in the top cylinder was quite wide, but I thought nothing of it.

The engine, 3 cylinder, 35 HP had a small steel cap on each valve stem, one of which, managed to come out enroute. Self enduced, don't you see? I went on home in the Bonanza, and after a long wait, received a call from Ken down at DeKalb, in darkness. He had lost one of those caps and had his first forced landing near some little town. He was able to get some help and put a 5/16 nut in place of the cap and took off. He reported the landing at DeKalb as "very colorful" with the fire from each short exhaust stack and the sparks from the tail skid.

The next morning I went to DeKalb to fly the last leg home. My son, a new A&P mechanic adjusted the valves and I took off, only to barely get out of the traffic pattern and ole Zeke lost power, it would It flew to OSH twice from Texas.

I have been very fortunate in picking forced landing spots. My favorite one was with my 8 year old grandson returning from Jack Winthrop's place. Out of the blue, number 2 cylinder blew off breaking the cable that was suppose to secure them in place. The landing site was most important because we were Southwest bound along Rt 121 right at Coit Rd.a four lane divided road running south of us. Not much traffic so I picked the lane with the least traffic and landed, just like any other landing. The first car that stopped had a cel phone so I called Jack Winthrop for help. The he and Nancy drove down to us and took us home. The next day with Jack's trailer we brought it home.

Several forced landings followed throughout our years together and luckily there were no injuries.

So July 2013 I decided that I was getting too old for all that excitement, and donated it to the Polar Grove Airport museum in Illinois. Steve Thomas, the airport owner, trailered it to it's new home and I was on hand to reassemble it. I was given a very nice reception party and everyone is happy.

CHAPTER CHOICE AWARD Antique Airfield

Blakesburg, Iowa: August 31, 2013.

Thirty members of the Texas Chapter of the AAA celebrated the 60th Anniversary Diamond Jubilee of the Antique Airplane Association at its annual fly-in. This year also marked the 75th anniversary of Don Luscombe's vision of the first commercially successful all-metal personal plane, and the featured aircraft was his Luscombe Model 8. Officially, there were 412 total aeroplanes in attendance, including seventy representative Luscombe aircraft ranging from original pre-war examples to highly modified aircraft (radial engine powered, high-horsepower, and clipped-wing Luscombes were displayed and flown). Also attending were Monocoupes, which were also a product of Iowan Don Luscombe's fertile mind and marketing ability.

Texas Chapter members presented nominees for the Chapter Choice award as Terry Wallace counted votes and went through the process of elimination to



determine the successful candidate. This year's Chapter Choice award went to Ms. Sharon Tinkler of Tullahoma, Tennessee for her Luscombe Model 8F with the Larson 150 HP engine conversion. The plaque was presented to Ms. Tinkler at the Sunday awards ceremony. This Luscombe,

NC1594B, is a very special airplane. Owned by Captain Bill Tinkler (retired, UAL) and his wife Sharon, "Captain Bill" as he was known by his great many friends, flew this aircraft with his first wife on a commemorative flight of the original 1924 "through" air mail service from New Jersey to San Francisco in 1984. The purpose of the flight was to highlight the Postal Service's role in establishing the airway beacon and marker system that first enabled coast-to-coast cross country flying. Captain Bill was sworn in as an official air mail pilot by the United States Postal Service and followed the original route, landing at all 17 original stops exactly as it was flown in the day. He delivered celebratory postmarked mail at each of the original stops along the way to the great enthusiasm of the Post Office employees, and the people of the towns along the route. We lost Captain Bill in October of last



year and he is dearly missed by his friends and family. Sharon Tinkler is the sole keeper of NC1594B now, and it was a very special "Blakesburg" for her to bring the airplane back to the annual gathering of so many of her friends at Antique Airfield.

Program: Door prizes were awarded. A motion to adjourn was made and seconded. The meeting ended at 12:35 AM


